

Waterside Litter Pick Safety Check List

Whether you're litter picking near a beach, canal path, lake, or river, follow this simple safety checklist to keep your group safe and the event enjoyable.

Quick Guide



- Dress appropriately: Layers for cold, waterproofs for rain, light clothes and hats for sun.
- Sun safety: Use sunscreen and wear a hat—even when it's cloudy.
- Be visible: Everyone should wear high-vis vests.
- Watch your step: Be careful on steep, uneven, or slippery ground.
- Avoid scratches: Steer clear of nettles, brambles, and thorns.
 Have a first aid kit.
- Stay hydrated: Bring refillable water bottles.
- Stay clear of roads: Avoid litter picking near traffic.
- Check tide times: For beach cleans, know the safe times and areas.
- Don't touch dangerous items: Report needles, medical waste, or dead animals—do not move them.
- Supervise vulnerable people: Always keep children and atrisk adults in sight.
- Stick together: Work in small groups, and agree on meeting points. Group leaders should carry a phone.
