Recycled Wildlife Craft Activity Guide

Let's dive into creativity! In this activity, we'll use recycled materials to create wildlife-themed crafts inspired by the ocean and our waterways.

Think: jellyfish made from plastic bags, fish from bottle caps, sea turtles from old cardboard — let imagination leads the way! If you need a helping hand we have a few fun ideas for you!

Recycled Fish

A used plastic bottle would make a great fish! You could cover the bottle with colourful fish scales out of old paper scraps, and add on fins and paper eyes!



Did you know that a plastic bottle can take up to 450 years to break down!

Paper Plate Sea Creatures!



You could use paper plates (or a cut out card or paper) to make lots of different types of sea creatures like crabs, jelly fish and turtles!

8 Million tonnes of plastic ends up in our oceans every year, and recycling helps protect marine life and reduces pollution.

Cardboard toilet rolls are handy crafting materials! You could make a whale by sticking on scraps of paper for eyes and finns. You could also paint it to add colour!
